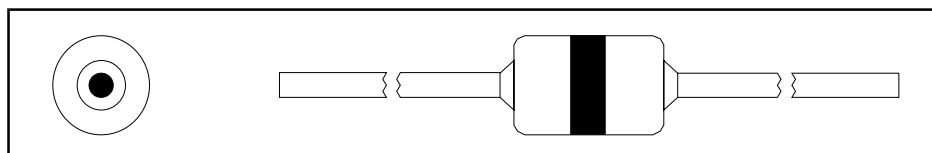
GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Silicon bidirectional trigger device in a glass envelope intended for use in triac and thyristor trigger circuits.

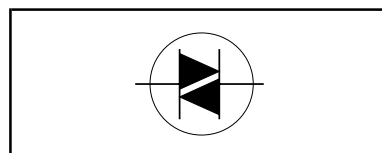
